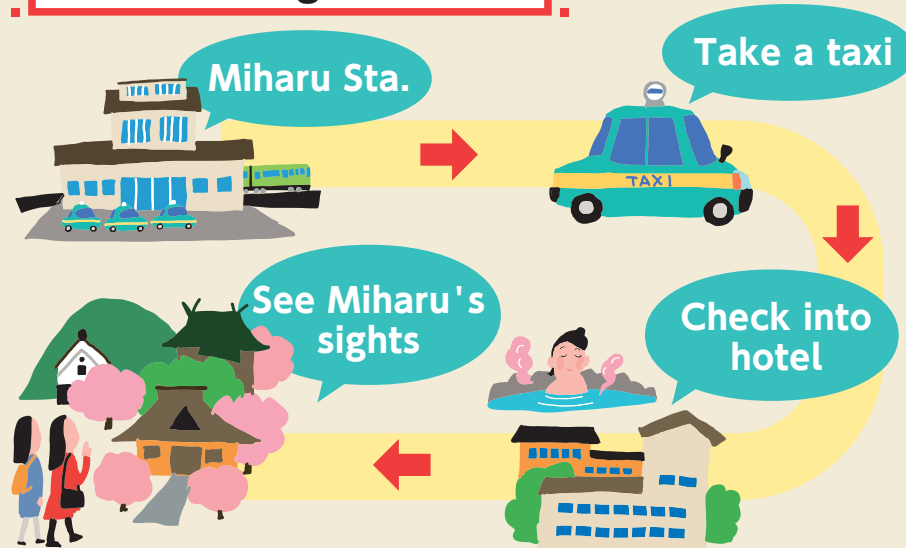

MEGOHIME

MEGOHIME is an anime set in Miharu in the near future.

It was produced to commemorate 450 years since Princess Mego's birth. She was the wife of Sendai's Date Masamune, a feudal lord known as the "One-eyed dragon" in the Warring States period, and supported him throughout his life.

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"Miharu" means "three springs" in Japanese, and refers to how plum, peach, and cherry blossom trees bloom in unison each year in Miharu Town. In springtime, over 10,000 sakura trees come into full bloom, including Miharu Takizakura, filling the land with the color and scent of cherry blossoms. Summer brings vibrant blues and awash of green trees. With autumn comes brilliant reds and yellows, and in winter the land is wrapped in peaceful, quiet white. Please come and enjoy all the colors of Miharu.

Miharu Folk Crafts

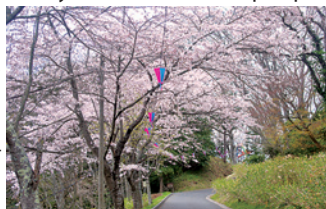
Miharu papier-mâché dolls, made from washi paper, date back to the Edo period. There are many types of dolls including daruma, masks, lucky charms, and dolls based on kabuki plays. Nowadays, many different types and colors and dolls are made.

Not only can you buy these dolls and other folk craft at Takashiba Deko Yashiki (Traditional Craft Village), but you can even try your hand at painting them there!



Shiroyama Park [Miharu Castle Ruins]

Miharu Castle existed in this area from the Warring States era through the Edo era. The castle ruins have been maintained as Shiroyama Park, where people gather to watch cherry blossoms in spring and hydrangeas bloom in the summer. It remains one of the most popular symbols of Miharu.



Goshuin Temple seal stamps Gojoin Castle seal stamps

Goshuin are seal stamps that visitors can receive at shrines and temples as proof of their visit. In most cases a small fee is required [typically only 300 yen to 500 yen].

Recently castles have also started creating seals to commemorate visits, calling them "Gojoin" ["jo" means "castle" in Japanese]. The castle ruins here in Miharu have their own commemorative Gojoin.

Miharukoma [local sake]

This local sake is made in Miharu's only sake brewery, where they use traditional sake brewing methods and only the highest quality rice and water. With its refreshing taste, Miharukoma has won a Gold Award for three straight years.

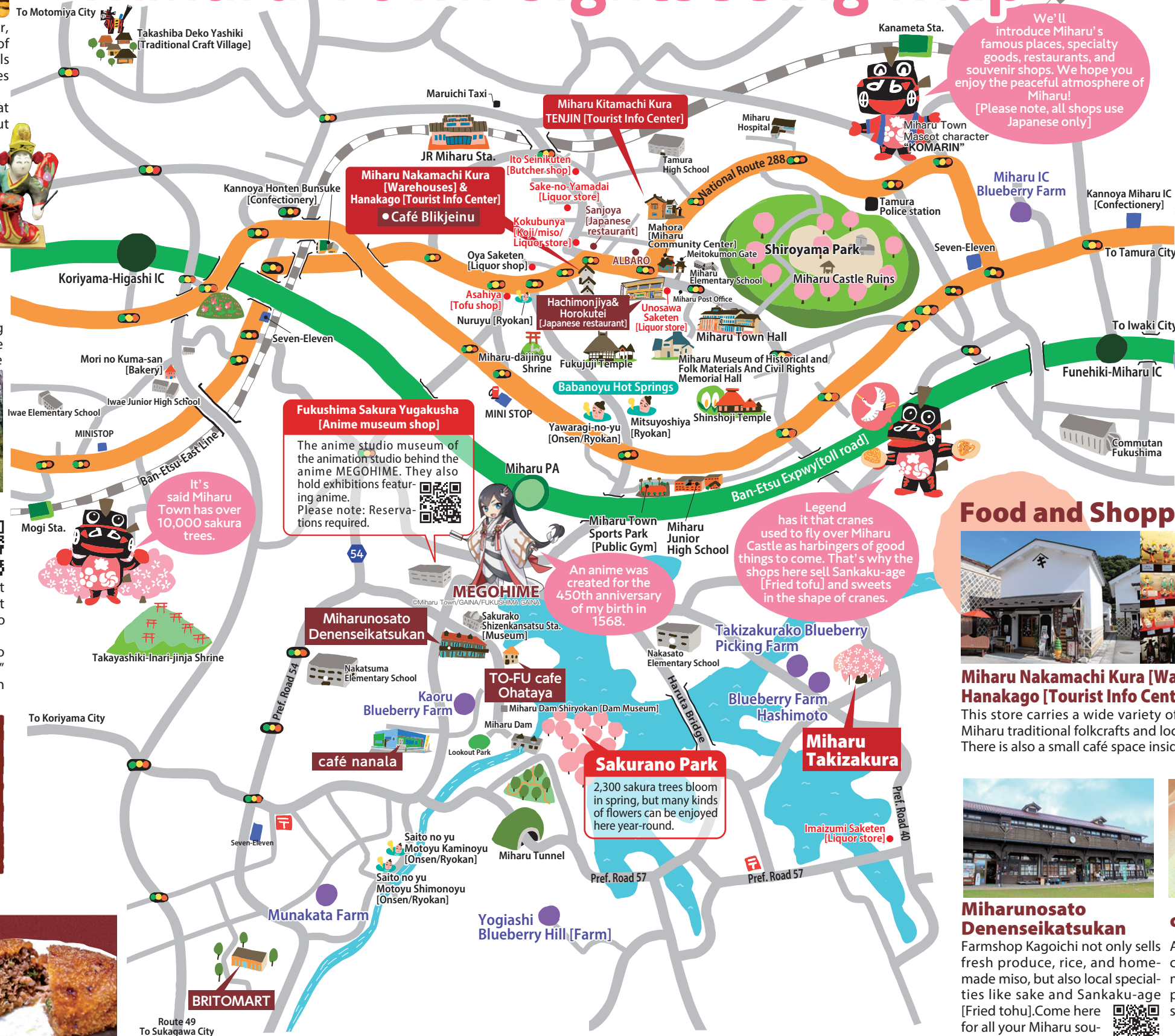


MIHARU GURUMENCHI

Miharu Takizakura

One of Japan's top three cherry trees. It has a history stretching over 1,000 years and is breathtakingly beautiful in full bloom. Countless small pale pink flowers bloom in all directions and came to be called "Takizakura" ["cherry blossom waterfall"] for their resemblance to cascading waterfalls.

Blueberry sightseeing farms

Many sightseeing farms sell blueberries and people love to pick them when in blueberry season. They also sell various products, such as blueberry juice.

TO-FU cafe Ohataya [Tofu restaurant]



Sankaku-age, Miharu's specialty triangle-shaped fried tofu, is made and sold here. Fried tofu is made of soybeans. Other soy products can be found here as well, such as tofu and miso. There is also a dining area where you can enjoy healthy dishes featuring fried and fresh tofu.

Sankaku-age [Fried tofu]



This deep-fried tofu dish is said to have originated in Miharu Castle, which is also known as the "Mai-zu-ru-jo [Dancing crane castle]". Its triangular shape resembles a crane flying high. Miharu's fried tofu is fragrant when grilled and pairs well with seasonal miso.
